Successes over the past year

Founded in 1977, Hospice East Bay has been privileged to serve patients and their families for over 47 years. Our care teams provide relief from pain and other symptoms, emotional and spiritual support, and practical assistance with end-of-life challenges as they arise, while honoring the needs and wishes of each patient and family.

Our care team includes physicians, registered nurses, case managers, medical social workers, home health aides, spiritual care and bereavement counselors, and trained volunteers. These team members ensure that family members can confidently care for their loved one and understand the expected course of the illness.

We provide grief support and counseling for Hospice East Bay patients and families from their admission through 13 months following the death of the patient. We also extend bereavement services to the greater community, whether they have any connection

Our palliative care program focuses on the relief of symptoms, provides assistance in navigating the complicated health care system, and offers the option of staying at home rather than going into the hospital.



Bruns House offers privacy and quiet that cannot be found in a hospital, combined with intensive round-the-clock care that cannot be achieved at home. Bruns House is the only licensed hospice facility in the Bay Area.
